Goals

• To help students understand that Holy Scripture is one, single story, centered on Jesus Christ and his saving work for us.

• To guide students to see that, while the Bible is long, complicated collection of books, its basic teachings can be clearly and accurately summarized and applied directly to our lives today through God's Commandments, Promises, Instructions, and Means of Grace.

• To equip students to begin to apply the stories of the Bible, the single Story of Scripture, and the specific Commandments, Promises, Instructions, and Means of Grace therein to their daily lives in family, church, school, and world.

Class Structure

• Daily readings from Concordia's Bible History (2015), with brief written exercises.

• Daily class discussion of readings from Concordia's Bible History, with amplification from the Bible and the Small Catechism.

- Unit tests for each of the 5 units below.
- Catechism memory work for those students who are using this class as their preparation for Confirmation.
